- Developing energy infrastructure in emergent countries

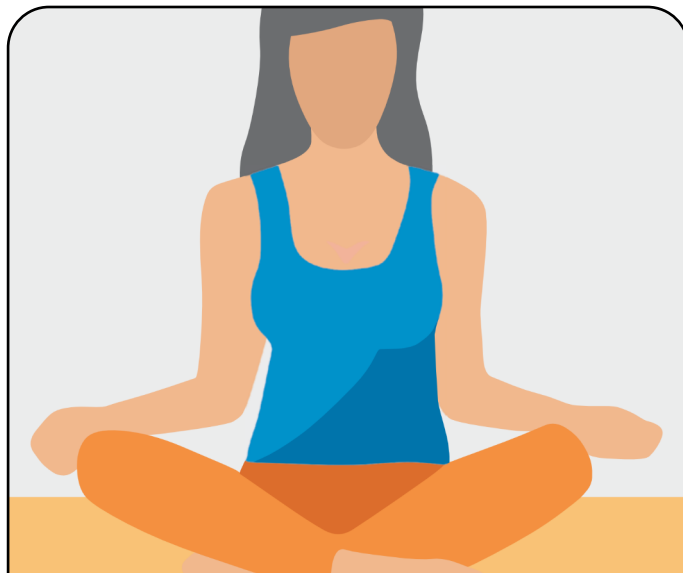

- Reducing mortality rates of pregnant women and children
- Developing new vaccines and drugs at affordable cost
- Improving health prevention and care systems
- Allowing everyone to benefit from health coverage giving access to basic care

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- Guaranteeing everyone a dignified job, compatible with their values, protected from physical and psychological abuse, paid with a fair salary, allowing them to rest and have free time, and which is meaningful
- Eradicating forced labor, human trafficking and child labor
- Defending workers' rights and ensuring their protection

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- Ensuring that all children, girls and boys, have access to free, quality education, including people with disabilities
- Contributing to ensuring that most people know how to read and write
- Facilitating equitable access to quality higher education
- Building safe and violence-free schools
- Reducing the proportion of young people out of school and without employment or training

- Improving the regulation and supervision of global financial institutions and markets

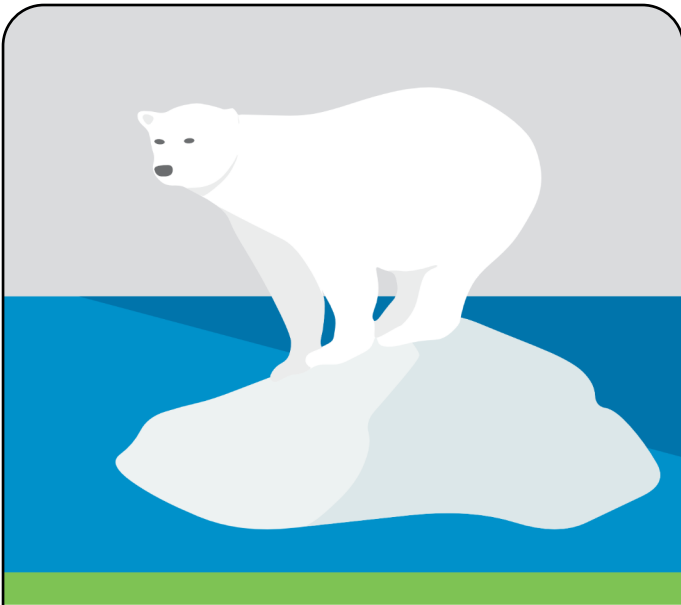
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- Ensuring access for all to quality, safe and affordable housing and transport systems

- Addressing violence and abuse within or between communities

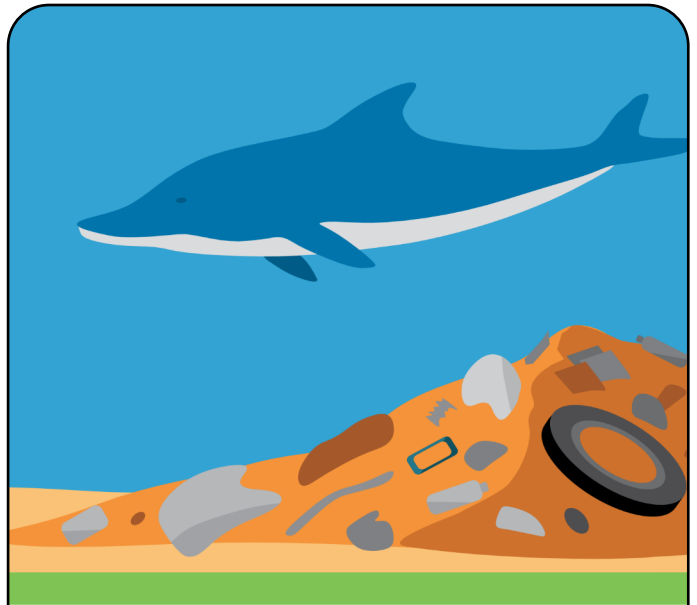
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- Facilitating safe, respectful and responsible migration and mobility
- Reducing exploitation, discrimination and abuse against migrants

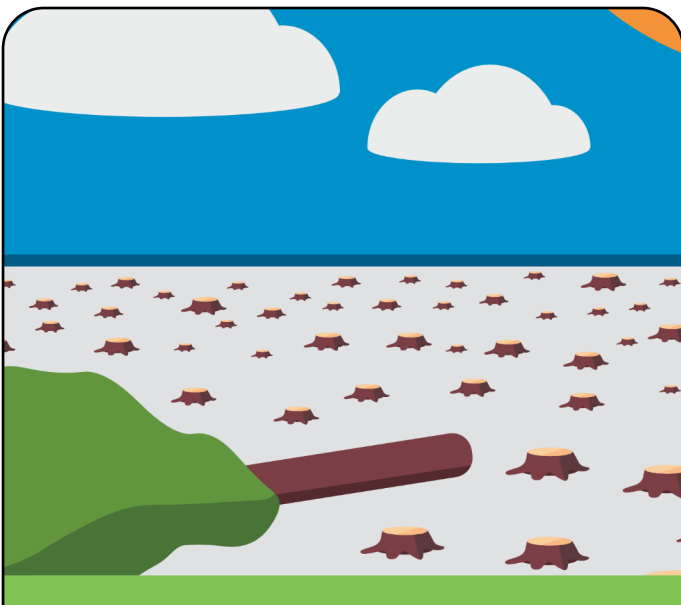

Instructions

Step 1

- Place in front of you the 3 sorting cards "Not at all," "A little," "A lot."
- Sort the "SCCS" cards according to the degree to which you feel touched or concerned by the objective represented by them.
- To help you, you can read the description on the back of the card.
- If necessary, write on the blank card provided for this purpose an objective that seems important to you, but which is absent in the deck of cards.

Instructions

Step 2

- Place in front of you the 2 sorting cards "Professional life," "Private life."
- Sort the "SCCS" cards in the "A lot" and/or "A little" piles according to the area of your life in which you would like or could pursue these goals.
- At the end of this sorting, think about how you could concretely contribute to achieving these objectives.
- Indicate how you could use your strengths, talents, interests, skills and/or personal characteristics to achieve this.
- Complete the sentence "My calling is to use my [strengths, talents, skills, characteristics] to contribute to [goals]."

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The objectives of the SCCS come from the Sustainable Development Goals adopted in 2015 by all member states of the United Nations (UN).

The creation of this card sort aims to initiate reflection on the links between professional choices and the needs of the world.
